1. INTRODUCTION

The present Study Guide is a brief presentation of the Curriculum and the structural organization of the Department of Interior Architecture, School of Design Sciences, International Hellenic University. The Department of Interior Architecture emerged from the integration into the International Hellenic University of the Department of Interior Architecture, Decoration and Object Design, which has been operating for a decade.

The Department of Interior Architecture, Decoration and Object Design was founded in 2009 and in 2019 was renamed Department of Interior Architecture and joined International Hellenic University which is based in Thessaloniki, Greece. The headquarters of the Department of I.A. is located in Serres and operates at the Facilities of Serres Campus.

The newly reformed and innovative curriculum of the Department provides a high level of study, offering all the necessary scientific supplies to students, critical thinking, research ability, and visual and technical scientific training for the study and implementation of a designed space which is the expression of the human-centered arts section.

Students, through active participation in the educational, research and cultural activities of the Department acquire the appropriate skills, abilities and knowledge to successfully respond to their subsequent professional career and contribute to the modernization and development of the scientific field in the country.

2. INTERNATIONAL HELLENIC UNIVERSITY

International Hellenic University was established by law 3391 of 2005 and started operating in 2008 and was based in Thermi, Thessaloniki, Greece. The International Hellenic University was re-established by Law (No 4610/2019), is based in Thessaloniki, comprises nine (9) Schools and thirty-three (33) Departments and is located in Thessaloniki, Kavala, Serres, Drama, Katerini, Kilkis, Didymoteicho. The two Schools (*School of Humanities, Social Sciences and Economics and the School of Science and Technology*) of the IHU belong to the University Center of International Programmes of Studies (UCIPS) of the International Hellenic University offering programmes that are taught exclusively in English.

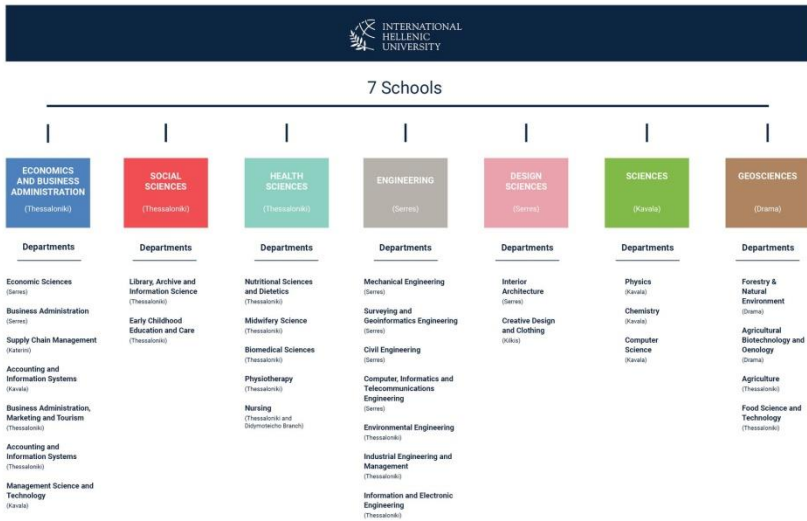


Image 1: University Structure

3. DEPARTMENT OF INTERIOR ARCHITECTURE

3.1. General Information

The Undergraduate Curriculum of the Department of Interior Architecture focuses on interior design and includes applications in new buildings, redesign and reuse of existing buildings and traditional preserved shells with emphasis on morphology, structure, interior structure, decoration, and furniture and space equipment. At the same time, artistic applications in the urban space are explored.

The program is implemented through traditional analog design methods but also with the application of modern digital methods, digital multimedia reproductions of the interior, intelligent design systems in buildings and useful objects and innovative applications.

3.2. Aim and Objectives

Main objective of the Programme of the Department of Interior Architecture is the promotion of science, of theory and practice of Interior Architecture, both by analog and digital means, with the parallel development of applied arts, and the design of furniture, industrial and decorative objects.

3.3. Study Structure and Organization

Duration of Study

The Curriculum of Interior Architecture is structured on the minimum compulsory study of eight semesters. In particular, the first seven semesters include only courses, while the last, eighth semester includes courses and the elaboration of the final Thesis Project and Dissertation.

Academic Calendar

The academic year starts on September 1st every year and ends on August 31st of the following year. The educational work of every academic year is organized in two semesters, the fall semester and the spring semester, each of which comprises 13 weeks of teaching and three weeks of exams. The exact dates of the courses of the winter and spring semesters of each academic year, as well as

the dates of the examinations, are determined by a decision of the Senate until the month of June of the previous year. The decision of the Senate also determines the duration of the holidays during the educational work and summer holidays.

Course Registrations-Statements

The registration of newly admitted students is done electronically, so the student submits the registration application and posts all the required documents on the electronic platform held at the institution within the legal deadlines as defined each time by the Ministry of Education.

Course registration procedures take place electronically, approximately two weeks after the start of the academic semester, on the dates set by the Department Assembly and announced by the Secretariat.

The course statement includes all the courses that students choose to take during the current academic semester and may not exceed 45 credits (ECTS) per semester. The application can not include the prerequired courses, in which the prerequisite has not been met. Students who have not submitted a course application will not be admitted to the relevant semester exams. Especially for newly admitted students, the registration for the first semester is made together with the application for their first registration in the Department.

Courses/Subjects

To receive the degree, students must successfully complete 52 courses and their dissertation.

The courses are distinguished in terms of their type in Compulsory (Y) and Compulsory Elective (YE) courses. In particular, the study program includes a total of 67 courses, of which 49 compulsory and 18 compulsory electives from which students choose 4 courses.

Also, the courses are distinguished in terms of their category, in General Infrastructure Courses (MGY), Special Infrastructure Courses (MEY) and Specialty Courses (ME).

Theory/Composition Courses

The curriculum includes theory courses and composition courses (theory & practice), in which theory and practice are an inseparable unit. "Theory" courses consist exclusively of theoretical lectures, seminars and theoretical progress papers, provide general knowledge and to a large extent serve as a background in synthetic courses.

The composition courses combine theory and practice and include lectures, presentations and laboratory exercises, which function as a single creative,

evolving open process. In composition classes, theory constantly feeds the creative laboratory practice and at the same time the practice seeks theoretical support and discussion.

The specific teaching method of "composition" courses as inseparable units (theory and practice), is applied in the most important similar or related university departments abroad and in Greece, in the only corresponding Department in UNIWA (University of West Attica). The content of the courses is enriched with architectural, historical, theoretical and artistic approaches.

Credits

The curriculum is structured upon the student's workload for each course and is characterized by a number of credits according to the European Credit System ECTS. The total workload of each semester is 750 hours. Each typical semester includes a total of 30 teaching units, which are distributed in each course depending on the teaching hours and the corresponding workload for each course.

Evaluation and Assessment

The evaluation of the performance in all the courses is recorded with the numerical scale from zero (0) to ten (10), based on the success grade of five (5).

The evaluation of students' performance in each course can be done in

- Written examination - Multiple choice questions and / or development of specific topics
- Oral exam
- Theory Essay
- Progress work - takes place during the Semester
- Critical choice questions in hypothetical cases
- Laboratory Exercises
- Portfolio organization
- Project presentation - group / individual

Determining the manner and process of assessment in each course is the sole responsibility of the instructor of the course.

3.4. Exams

The exams are held exclusively after the end of the winter semester and the spring semester during the periods January - February and June - July, for the courses taught in these semesters, Students are eligible to take the courses in

both semesters before the start of the winter semester of the following academic year, during the period of September.

In particular, the winter semester exams start one week after the end of the semester courses, last for three weeks and are usually followed by a free week before the start of the spring semester courses. The Spring Semester exams start one week after the end of the semester courses and last for three weeks.

3.5. Project Thesis Dissertation

The dissertation is a compulsory course in the curriculum of the Department of Interior Architecture. Each student of the last standard semester is required to prepare a dissertation. It is prepared under the supervision of teaching staff and focuses on the application of the Department's cognitive objects. For the elaboration of the thesis, the premises and the equipment of the Department may be used, if necessary.

The dissertation is an obligation to obtain a degree and is assigned to 16 credits (ECTS).

The elaboration of a thesis is mandatory for all students of the Department. The dissertation is assigned to a student of the Department at the beginning of the last semester (8th) and if the student has successfully completed all courses of the study program, or owes up to five courses of which only one can be a Specialty Course.

The dissertation must be completed within one academic semester. The duration of the work can be extended up to a total of three semesters. After the expiration of this time the issue is automatically removed by the student and he / she is obliged to undertake a new issue following the whole process from the beginning.

At the beginning of each semester (first two weeks) an application for starting a dissertation is submitted to the Secretariat together with a certificate of detailed grade of the student. The statement states the supervising professor and the title of the subject. The statement is completed and signed by the student and the supervising professor and then (third week) approved by the department assembly.

3.6. Internship

The Internship is an optional full-time job of two (2) calendar months in the private or public sector before receiving the degree. The Internship is a free elective course, corresponds to 3 ECTS and is equivalent to an elective course.

The Internship takes place after the end of the fourth semester. Each student can take an Internship only once during his / her studies. The Internship can take place either at home or abroad through the Erasmus program.

3.7. Degree

The degree certifies the successful completion of the studies and indicates a grade. The score is in order of success: "Excellent" from 8.50-10, "Very Good" from 6.50 to 8.49 and "Good" from 5 to 6.49. The degree is obtained as defined by the current provisions of the Department, provided that the students have successfully completed the study in 52 courses of the Study program and the Final Thesis.

The degree is extracted to the nearest two (2) decimal places and is derived from the formula:

$$B = \frac{\delta_1\beta_1 + \delta_2\beta_2 + \dots + \delta_v\beta_v}{\delta_1 + \delta_2 + \dots + \delta_v}$$

Where $\beta_1, \beta_2, \dots, \beta_v$ are the corresponding grades of all the courses attended by the student and $\delta_1, \delta_2, \delta_3, \dots, \delta_v$ are the corresponding credits

- The Student has completed the obligations for obtaining a degree if he / she have a total of 240 credits.
- Successful completion of at least 52 courses is required to obtain a degree.
- 48 are compulsory courses.
- The 4 are elective courses compulsory and are selected from the 5th to the 8th semester.
- The dissertation is mandatory and takes place after the completion of most courses and not earlier than the 8th semester.
- The dissertation is prepared individually or by a group of two students under the guidance of a member of the teaching staff of the Department.

- The Final Thesis has 16 credits.
- The students of the Department have the opportunity to do an internship for two (2) months. The internship has 3 credits and is equivalent to a Compulsory Elective Course.

3.8. Access to further Studies

There is no Postgraduate Program and Doctoral Program in the Department of Interior Architecture. However, the graduates of the Department after the end of their studies can continue for postgraduate studies / doctoral studies, either in Greek universities. or in the respective institutions abroad.

The terms Postgraduate Studies refer to programs of specialization of higher education graduates in the scientific field that interests them, with the ultimate goal of promoting research and technology. In recent years, there has been a continuous increase in the demand for postgraduate studies from graduates, while at the same time, the number of employers who want or require a postgraduate degree, as proof of desirable skills, experience and specialized scientific knowledge.

The approved postgraduate / doctoral programs that operate, are addressed to almost all branches of science and are constantly enriched by the addition of new ones. The duration of studies varies from one to two years. The supporting documents required for admission to a postgraduate program vary depending on the conditions set by the department that organizes the program and on the field of study.

3.9. Text Books/Eudoxus

Students are entitled to a free textbook for each compulsory or elective course of their curriculum required to obtain a degree. The textbooks are provided to students through the electronic textbook management service "EUDOXUS". Every semester students declare through the web portal of EUDOXUS system, the textbooks of the courses they wish to take, if they have included them in the course statement of the semester.

4. MOBILITY /ERASMUS

The Erasmus + program is a program of the European Union, which gives the opportunity to students of Higher Education to complete a part of their studies in a corresponding Institution of Europe or their internship, with full academic recognition and duration of 3-12 months. The aim of the program is to enhance skills and employability as well as the modernization of education, training and youth systems in all areas of Lifelong Learning.

The new Erasmus + 2021-2027 Program is a continuation of previous programs offering support and funding to mobility and transnational cooperation projects in the fields of education, training, youth and sport. At the same time, it updates its priorities, emphasizing diversity, promotes the participation of all and offers equal opportunities to more people.

As part of the Erasmus + 2021-2027 actions, the Department of Interior Architecture enables its students to move to the University of Nicosia, Cyprus.

Feeding/Accommodation

International Hellenic University provides its students with the opportunity to eat in a fully equipped restaurant on the campus of the University of Serres. All students whose family income does not exceed 45,000 Euros per year have the right to free food (Government Gazette 1965, τ.Β' / 18-6-2012). Relevant information is given by the office of the Student Department (ground floor, library building).

Students have the opportunity to stay in houses or apartments of their choice. The State grants an annual housing allowance of students amounting to 1,000 Euros, with the conditions set by law 3220/2004 as in force.

Insurance

Students are entitled to full insurance coverage provided they are not insured with another institution. In this case, it is necessary to declare their deletion from the insurance fund of their family.

Health and medical Services

Uninsured undergraduate and postgraduate students are entitled according to law No. 171598 / Z1 / 12.12.2017 of the Ministry of Education, full medical and hospital care in the National Health System (Ε.Σ.Υ.) with coverage by the relevant Health Services (ΕΟΠΥΥ).

Students now apply to Public Health Structures with their AMKA.

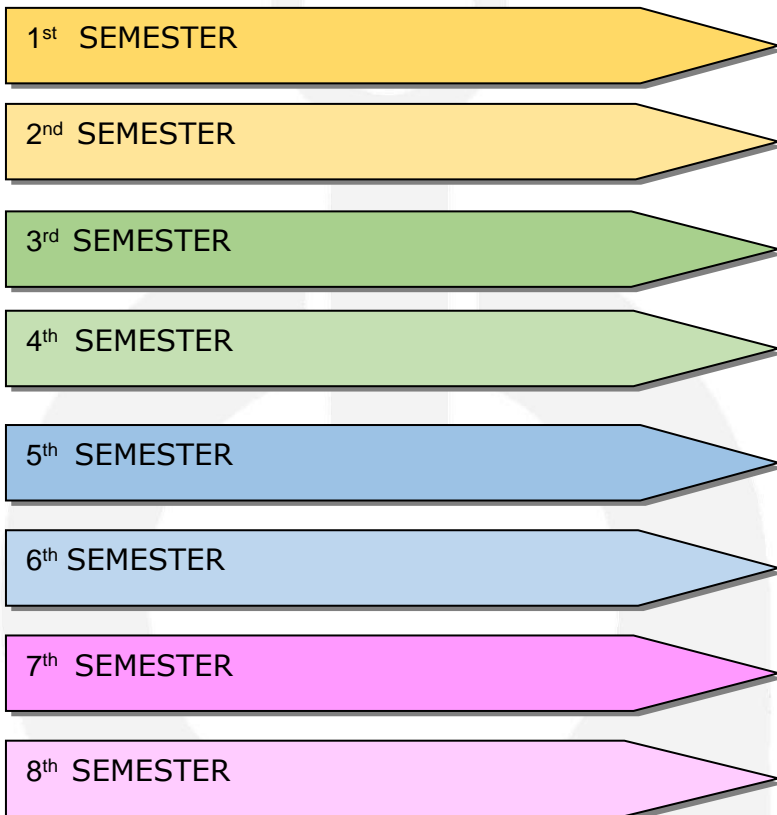
